Despite significant delays with securing grant funding, Southwick's Neighbourhood Plan Review is now making really good progress.

Work on assessing potential sites for future housing development coming to fruition and The Steering Group have also collated and mapped all the significant landscape views in the village. A public consultation will follow soon.

A reminder from Wiltshire Council Operational Flood Working Group

A s winter approaches and the risk of heavy rainfall and flooding increases, I have been asked to remind those of us living on the river Lambrok to please keep the river bed and banks free flowing and clear of obstructions. Any matter that could obstruct the flow of water either on your land or downstream if washed away, possibly leading to flooding.

On one occasion an old oil drum washed through the river at the bottom of my garden and on another a sheet of corrugated iron was rescued from the flood waters!

For further flood risk information – Google - Check for flooding in England - GOV.UK. Scroll down and click onto – Find a river, sea, groundwater or rainfall levels.

Enter your postcode, then click onto Lambrok Stream at Trowbridge Southwick to see a graph showing the current river level and further information.

Scroll down to related content and click onto – check your long term flood risk. Click onto Start now > and follow instructions to find a Flood risk summery of surface water for an area around your address. Scroll down to view a map of the risk of surface water flooding.

Return to the Flood risk summary for an area around your address and scroll down to view a map of the risk of flooding from rivers and the sea. These maps are interactive.

We are not in an area at risk of flooding from reservoirs or groundwater.
