

The Southwick Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) was made by Wiltshire Council in October 2021. This followed a successful referendum where the majority of voters agreed that Wiltshire Council should use the Neighbourhood Plan to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area.

The work to prepare the made NDP began in 2017. Since then, there have been changes to the national and local policy context, and therefore some of the evidence base is becoming increasingly dated.

Southwick Parish Council have decided to undertake a review of the NDP to ensure that it remains effective and continues to meet the objectives and ambitions of the Parish.

The review will also ensure that the NDP will remain in conformity with the emerging Wiltshire Local Plan Review, which is currently being prepared by Wiltshire Council, particularly when referring to the ability of Southwick to meet the future housing requirements in the extended plan period to 2038.

Members of the public, along with members of the Parish Council, were invited to

become part of a Neighbourhood Planning Steering Group. Response for Steering Group volunteers has been very strong, and Steering Group meetings have been taking place.

A firm of professional consultants have also been appointed to support the Steering Group in delivering the Neighbourhood Plan Review.

However, all has not gone to plan. The Government scheme which provides grant funding to qualifying bodies, has been subject to significant delays and as a result the completion of Southwick's Neighbourhood Plan Review is currently running behind schedule.

But, with the support of our consultants, the Steering Group can now make better progress with delivering the Neighbourhood Plan Review.

So please keep an eye for further details of upcoming Neighbourhood Plan events, Public Consultation's and more progress updates going forward, during the Autumn weeks and months to come.

Just some thoughts and pictures on a pleasant Sunday afternoon walk in the reserve.

It was a bit breezy and with some threatening clouds but warm. I walked along Lambrok Meadow and spotted a few Small Whites and a couple of battered Meadow Browns; not an auspicious start but so different when I got to one of my favourite butterfly spots – the Old Dog Pond.

Here about a dozen pairs of Common

Blues were feeding on the Ragwort flowers along with a couple of Small Coppers, Gatekeepers and some Small Whites.

A Comma passed through the area and to my great surprise I saw and






photographed a Cinnabar caterpillar on the flower head of a Ragwort.

Despite extensive searching, it was the only one I found. There were a couple of dragonflies swooping about and feeding but they refused to settle and be photographed and identified. I meet up with Clive and Dillon and we had a leisurely walk round to Puddle Corner, along the bottom of Sleeper field, into Sheep field and then on to Fiveways.

On the edge of the copse in the setaside at the top of Kestrel field there was an odd butterfly feeding on the Ragwort, luckily it stayed static and once home looking at the pictures realised it was a female Brimstone – I was really pleased. In the long grass lots of chirruping and we got pictures of Roesel's Bush-crickets, the long winged versions.





It has been a funny year for butterflies within the reserve, they seem to be coming in waves. Prior to the hay cut, Meadow Browns dominated then Ringlets multiplied.

Always in attendance were Speckled Woods and of late Large and Small Whites. Since then we have had Skippers, Marbled Whites, Red Admirals and Peacocks interspersed with Gatekeepers and Small Coppers.









Odd individuals have been the Silverwashed Fritillary, Painted Lady and a Five Spot Burnet Moth.

Still plenty of time this year and if the weather improves, there could well be some interesting sightings.

Allow us a few moments to fill in the background to this. Around three to four years ago a team from within Southwick Baptist Church had set up and started FIASS (Free Introductory Advice Service Southwick), a free service available to all offering debt advice, benefits advice and assistance with CV writing and form filling. This service is still available at www.southwickbaptistchurch.org.uk)

Shortly after that we began kicking the idea of starting a drop-in cafe for the people of the village. Then along came the pandemic, numerous lockdowns, and a prolonged period of social distancing and church closure which put the brakes on any thoughts of this.

This year, 2023, as we have now come to terms with 'living with Covid', we have been excited

to revisit the idea and we are pleased to say we held our first drop-in cafe on Tuesday 1st November 2022. So we are off and running!

The purpose of the drop-in cafe is simple. To reach out to the community and open the doors of the church for the benefit of the local people, providing the opportunity for drawing village folk to meet together in a friendly environment where there will be a welcome for everyone whether a church-goer or not.

Everyone is welcome to come along, and stay as long as you like. We will provide free tea/ coffee (or squash) and cake and/or biscuits – so why not pop along for a cuppa and a chat.

The **Beat the Street** game is coming to Southwick, North Bradley, and Trowbridge Town from 4th October to 1st November.

**Beat the Street** encourages people to get outside and to get active and is open to anyone of any age who would like to take part. The game works by turning towns and villages into a real-life game and residents will soon start to see special sensors called Beat Boxes appearing on lampposts around the area.

Prior to the game, primary school pupils from participating schools will be provided with cards while parents and teachers will also receive a card from the school so they can accompany children.

The wider community can pick up a free contactless card from a distribution point listed on the website **www.beatthestreet.me** Alternatively, players aged 13+ can choose to participate via a mobile app, which can be downloaded via Google Play or iOS App Store.

Players join a school or community team to join, or you can set up your own with a minimum of players. Players then walk, cycle or wheel between the number of 38 Beat Boxes which are spaced half a mile apart, hovering the cards as they go to collect points, the further players travel, the more points they score and win prizes.

#### Week 1 - Go Play

This week is about getting people used with the rules of the game and encourage them to register. We encourage the people to find the beat boxes in their area and tapping them to score point and win prizes.

#### Week 2 – Go Explore

We encourage player to discover the local history and culture, explore their local heritage and visit iconic places. We will have random boxes giving double or triple points.

#### Week 3 – Go Travel

Double points on the commute this week between certain hours of the day, cycle, running, skateboards, walking, roller stakes.

#### Week 4 - Go Wild

We encourage players to discover nature during this week (we will have mobile boxes in parks and green places giving double points).
